

* * SUMMARY PARAGRAPHS EXPLAINING JUVENILE'S ATTAINED SCALE SCORES * *

TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE

RISK PERCENTILE: 64

This youth's Truthfulness Scale score is in the medium risk (40 to 69th percentile) range. All Juvenile Detention Exam scales are accurate. This youth has established characterological armor and can be evasive regarding self-disclosure. Sometimes individualized attention and emotional support of endeavor helps youths focus and prioritize.

ALCOHOL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE

RISK PERCENTILE: 78

This youth's Alcohol Scale score is in the problem risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Problem risk scorers drink excessively. Check the "recovering" item answers to #53 and 102. This youth answered Juvenile Detention Exam items 30, 48, 53, 98, 99, 102 and 103 in a deviant or problematic direction. Recommendations: mandatory attendance at substance abuse group counseling with age peers and/or Al-Ateen meetings. This alcohol Scale score is problematic.

DRUGS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE

RISK PERCENTILE: 84

This juvenile's Drugs Scale score is in the problem risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Problem risk scorers use drugs. Check this juvenile's answers to the "recovering" items #72 and 102. This youth answered the following items 28, 32, 50, 72, 100 and 102 in a deviant or problematic direction. Recommendations: mandatory attendance at substance abuse group counseling with age peers, augmented (not replaced) with a juvenile version of Narcotics Anonymous - if available.

VIOLENCE SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE

RISK PERCENTILE: 91

This youth's Violence Scale score is in the severe risk (90 to 100th percentile) range. This severe problem score did not occur by chance. This is a violent person, who, when aroused, can be intimidating, threatening and dangerous. Recommendations: match problem "severity" with treatment program "intensity." Consider intensive individual or group counseling. If a history of violence upgrade treatment intensity.

ANTISOCIAL SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE

RISK PERCENTILE: 96

This juvenile's Antisocial Scale score is in the severe risk (90 to 100th percentile) range. These individual's often reveal a moral or ethical blunting. They often lie, cheat, steal, runaway, are moody and seem emotionally indifferent. Recommendations: consider the possibility of long term group counseling in a structured milieu. Many severely antisocial youth are difficult to manage and help.
